

Vaccination Programme

Combined Vaccination Against Equine Influenza and Tetanus

Primary Course

1st injection – Proteqflu TE
after 4 months old

2nd injection – Proteqflu TE
within **21 – 92 days** after 1st vaccination

3rd injection – Proteqflu TE
within **150 – 215 days** after 2nd vaccination

Booster vaccination annually within 365 days. If this not done within 365 days the vaccination programme must start again!

- Horses are highly susceptible to Tetanus. It is extremely important that your horse is protected against Tetanus.
- Pregnant mares should be given a booster 4-6 weeks prior to foaling. This provides passive immunity, which covers the foal up to 5 months of age.
- Unprotected foals should be protected with tetanus antitoxin serum within 24 hours of birth. The foal's umbilical cord should be treated with Iodine directly after birth to help prevent entry of infection.

Tetanus Course

1st Injection – Equip T
after 5 months of age if mare had been vaccinated prior to foaling

2nd Injection – Equip T
Within 4-6 weeks after 1st injection

Booster vaccination every 36 months

Jockey Club Regulations

The Jockey Club have strict vaccination requirements which must be adhered too if you wish to enter their competitions or onto their premises. If the requirements are not kept the Jockey Club have the right to bar the horse from entering the premises.

1st Equine Influenza Vaccination

2nd vaccination after 21 to 92 days from 1st vaccination

3rd vaccination after 150 to 215 days from 2nd vaccination

Yearly booster here after, the last permissible day being the same day as the previous years vaccination

Horses must not race until the 8th day after the day of vaccination
Other Societies which comply with the Jockey Club rules:

- British Eventing and Showjumping
- British Endurance Riding Association
- Events which take place on races courses or Jockey Club land

FEI Regulations for Equine Influenza Vaccinations

1st Equine Influenza Vaccination

2nd vaccination after 21 to 92 days from 1st vaccination

3rd vaccination (or 1st booster) must be given within 180 days or 6 months +21 days from 2nd vaccination

Booster vaccinations must be given at **6 month** + 21days intervals.

No injections must be administered within the preceding 7 days including the day of the competition or of entry into the competition stables.

Societies which require compliance with the FEI regulations include:

- British Showjumping
- British Eventing
